

The Word of God teaches us that our faith should be alive and vibrant. We should all see daily evidences of God at work in our lives. However, sometimes manifestations of blessings are not as apparent as they should be. In most cases, we do not see our blessings because we are not looking for them. In other cases, we are running from God so He cannot bless us in the way He might do so otherwise. Sadly, many are just not excited about their walk with God.

God will always honor our faith, but for faith to manifest itself, a vehicle must be provided. This vehicle gives a place for faith to be verified and displayed for the glory of the Lord. A man, who says he has faith but displays no real evidence of it in his life, is being deceived. It is a claim without verification. God provides no picture to be displayed because there is no frame in which to place it. As God works through us Christ is glorified, the church is strengthened, the lost may be won, and we can bring a new dimension of life to our Christianity.

First, A Godly Prayer Ministry May Help Bring Your Christianity to Life.

We all make decisions every day. Some of them are minor, like what to wear and where to go for lunch. Others are major, requiring much thought and prayer. Jeremiah once prayed and asked God for guidance. This is still a good prayer for us to pray today.

O Lord, I know that the way of man is not in himself, it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps. Jeremiah 10:23.

On our own, we are not smart enough to have a good marriage or to be a good parent. We do not have the discretion to plan our own course. The carnal Christian does pretty much as they please, but the mature Christian seeks the will of God in his decisions. We must all adopt the attitude of John the Baptist who declared of Jesus, "He must increase, and I must decrease."

When you are in the midst of making a major decision, you need to ask the Lord to give you grace to walk in holiness so there will be nothing hindering you from hearing His voice. You will bring your Christianity to life as you begin to experience answered prayer.

Don't just speak prayers out loud; listen for the voice of the Lord as well. Keep a journal so that you can write down what the Lord speaks to you in these special times. Prayer is an essential Christian discipline that should be a part of every mature believer's life.

### Second, A Godly Dream May Help Bring Your Christianity to Life.

When God wants to work in your life, He often gives you a dream. The dream will focus on what the Lord wants you to do and how you can best prepare for your mission. He may also give you advance information on how your life will advance the Kingdom.

God gave Noah the dream of building an ark. He also gave dreams to



Abraham, Nehemiah, and others. He may be attempting to do the same for you.

How do you know when a dream is from God or when it's just something you've thought up yourself? Perhaps this is how:

"Now unto Him that is able to do exceeding abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that worketh in us." Ephesians 3:20.

More than mere human ideas or thoughts and more than our highest desires, hopes, or prayers, that's what the power of God can do. In other words, if a dream comes from God, it will be so big in your life that you can't do it on your own. If you could do it on your own, you wouldn't need to exercise faith to accomplish it. The Bible teaches us "whatsoever is not of faith is sin." (Romans 14:23).

God often attempts to bring your Christianity to life by giving you a dream. The danger is you may not recognize it for what it is. You may think it is just some random thoughts, but perhaps not! They may be utterances from God which may be the very thing needed to bring your Christianity to life.

Third, Godly Memories May Help Bring Your Christianity to Life.

"As he thinketh in his heart, so is he" Proverbs 23:7.

As we go back and carefully look over our Christian life, we will see miracles which may have been overlooked as they occurred. Tragically, we are often very insensitive to manifestations of God working in our lives. We need to understand that we usually remember things we consider to be important. Most of us didn't forget to show up on our wedding day, nor do we usually forget to eat. Sadly, we are often prone to forget important stuff while remembering things we should forget. I once heard a story about two friends who were talking. One of them asked the other, "Don't you remember that time when your husband did this?" Her friend replied, "No, I don't recall him doing it, but I do distinctly remember forgetting that he did it."

If you delight in holding on to your painful memories, go right ahead. But you're not going to be happy! Why not make a choice to be grateful for your life and saturate your thoughts with good memories.

We can easily develop patterns of thinking whether positive or negative. For example, when you listen to a certain song it may get "stuck" in your mind. Likewise, when we think about anything for an extended period of time, we create a "sound" in our minds. This sound has a way of dominating our perspective of life, eventually making us sensitive to things that have the same "tone."

Then, like a man with a tuning fork, we begin to attract and be attracted to people, circumstances, and feelings that are tuned to that same pitch. Our minds become reinforced in their beliefs by the influence of others. It has been said that whatever fills your mind will eventually fill your life! So, think on good things as they can help bring your Christianity to life.

## Fourth, Fasting May Help Bring Your Christianity to Life.


Fasting from food can be done for a variety of purposes, either physical or spiritual. So abstaining from food alone doesn't constitute a Christian fast. Instead, a Christian fast is accompanied by a special focus on prayer, often substituting the time you'd spend eating with prayer instead.

Fasting offers a way to impose self-control in your life; it gives you a "splash in the face" to awaken you to the need to take charge of your life. Remember, you are dependent on God for things far more important than food. Fasting isn't a complicated business. When you fast, you don't eat. You stay away from all food or refrain from specific types of food for a set amount of time. The duration









of the fast may be a solo meal, one day, or several days, and it is one way God can use to help bring your Christianity to life.

## Fifth, Giving May Help Bring Your Christianity Life.

God specifically tells us to test Him in this one way. Tithing is an act of faith—faith that when we give to God, that He will still provide our needs. When we give generously we declare, "God is my security. God is my comfort. God is my provider. I am trusting God, not myself."

Giving takes faith. Therefore, if you want to grow your faith, give. Give to see the good news of Jesus advance. Give to your church, to your neighbors, and to help the poor and afflicted. You'll feel the stretch, it won't be easy, but don't worry, you're growing those faith muscles, and it may help bring your Christianity to life.

### Sixth, Studying the Word May Bring Your Christianity to Life.

Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.

Matthew 4:4

Jesus is using a natural human idea to convey a spiritual thought. He's saying to us that what food is to the body, the Word of God is to the spirit. You can feed your spirit on God's Word and thereby feed your faith, because God's Word is faith food. So, utilizing the Word of God can help bring your Christianity to Life.

### Seventh, Celebrations Can Help Bring Your Christianity to Life.

Many believers dislike most all holiday celebrations, which of course is a matter of personal choice. Personally, I might agree with some of their concerns, although I would not necessarily agree with their conclusions.

When, in a godly fashion, we celebrate Valentine's Day, birthdays or other events it can bring glory to the Lord. It is often a way of celebrating His blessings upon us. Actually, God originated many celebrations Himself. These celebrations, usually called "feasts" were for the nation of Israel. You may recall that the first three feasts Passover, Unleavened Bread, and First Fruits occurred in rapid succession in the spring of the year over a period of eight days. They came to be referred to collectively as "Passover."

The fourth feast, Harvest, occurred fifty days later, at the beginning of the summer. By New Testament times this feast had come to be known by its Greek name, Pentecost, a word meaning fifty.

The last three feasts Trumpets, Atonement, and Tabernacles extended over a period of twenty-one days and occurred in the fall of the year. They would come to be known collectively as *Tabernacles*.

Most of these feasts required a preparation time. They usually continued for several days, they often involved food, they often involved fellowship with family and other believers, they often involved music and decoration, and they certainly involved worship, praise, and reflection.

My point is, learning to extract everything possible out of your celebrations can bring life to your Christianity. Experience the joy of giving and receiving, the joy of decorating and baking, the joy of praise and worship, the joy of the stories, the music, the movies, the history, and the memories. Experience the celebration, make sure your festivities glorify the Lord, and then make them last as long as you can.

After all, it was God who taught us how to celebrate through the various feasts of the Old Testament, several of which pointed directly to Christ. So, although we are not under some ritual law, let us celebrate; for in doing so, we might easily bring a renewed spirit of life and vitality to our faith.

So, to those with a dreary faith and a sluggish testimony, the way to bring your Christianity to life is to breathe a little life into your Christianity. Hopefully, these few suggestions might be beneficial in this regard.





## Father Of Our Country

This month, we celebrate the birth of the "Father of easy death. Tragically, neither was possible at the our Country". History has given our world few men to equal George Washington.

Back in 1799, a little more than 30 months into his retirement, the 67 year old Washington complained about a cough, runny nose, and a distinct hoarseness of voice. His physicians had been summoned and found the former President already in a weakened condition.

Using the best known medical procedures of the day, the physicians removed more than 80 ounces of his blood (40 percent of his total blood volume) over a 12hour period. Modern medicine would agree that this massive blood loss could not have helped the president's condition, and likely hastened his death.

It is easy to criticize Washington's doctors. However, the fact is they did the best they could using methods accepted by the medical profession of the day.

Just like all of us, General Washington hoped his physicians would help him to recover, and if recovery was not possible, perhaps they could help him face an time—nor are they possible today.

Of course, medical science has greatly advanced over the past 200 years, but it is still God who must heal. He may use the skill of the physician or the chemistry of the medicine, but it is still the Great Physician who heals. The surgeon may cut the flesh and sew it back together, but it is God who truly mends the flesh. Furthermore, it is not possible to face an easy death apart from the intervention of God. 
No matter how much pain love brings, it is always worth it. Take the risk and love unconditionally. God did!

"Examine me, O Lord, and prove me; try my reins and my heart."

**Psalm 26:2** 

Let's be honest, when was the last time you prayed a prayer like the one in **Psalm 26**? Being serious, when was the last time you prayed for God to take a real close look into your heart and mind? Not that He does not already know, but are we willing to allow Him to not only look but also reveal what He finds in us?

To examine means to inspect someone or something in detail to determine their nature or condition; to investigate thoroughly. Do we really have the nature of God? The Word teaches us that the old man dies. and we take on the new man in Christ Jesus (Ephesians 4:22-24). We are called in the Word, "new creatures". That new man should look like Jesus as we live in Christ. Whereas we once walked in the sin nature, we now walk in Christ and live by the Spirit of God. What does our nature reveal about who we are in Christ?

To prove means to demonstrate the truth or existence of something by evidence or argument. With this in mind, it means to allow God to look at us in line with His Word. His Word is truth! So how close are we to living the truth? There is no doubt whatsoever you are living at some level of His truth, but how much? Are we living by what our society says is the truth or what God says is truth? Jesus said we could know Him (Truth)

and that He would set us free. The freedom He offers is nothing less than abundant life in Him.

A test is a procedure to establish the quality, performance, or reliability of something. Without a doubt, we are valuable to God. Why else would He offer up His Son for us? How valuable are we to the body of Christ where it also counts? If you or I stopped attending church today, would it even make a difference

in that particular ministry? What are we worth to others God has put in our path? On a scale of 1 to 10, how reliable are we in the things of God? How well are we performing the task He created us to do?

While asking God to examine, prove, and test us would seem like a tough thing to do, it would be the best thing we could do. We are not asking God to judge us and bring sentence on us, but to simply show us who we are, where we are currently with Him, and where He desires for us to be. It is God's desire we become all He has created us to be. When we take a test, it reveals what we know and what we don't know. If we seem to fail in some part, it allows us to know where we need to study more.

In Psalm 26, David was not seeking God's judgement, but instead, he was welcoming God's



guidance in the areas he was coming up short. Are you ready to go further, dream bigger, love larger, live more abundantly, and grow stronger spiritually? If so, pray this Scripture and allow God to reveal some areas that may be hindering your promotion. He is already blessing the things you are doing right in accordance to His Word. Don't be afraid of the improvements He is going to make. God is loving and longsuffering toward us so He will not put more on us than we can bear. Let's thank God for the things we are getting right, and let's trust Him with the things we can do better.
