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
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After His resurrection, Jesus still had His scars, and He displayed them with pride and confidence. He understood that God often leaves the scars of our past wounds as evidence of His power.

Scars can be one of Satan's favorite deceptions. He likes to make us believe that the scars of our past are ugly and deforming. So we try our best to disguise our wounds so we will look like the "normal" people. But no one is normal. Each person has their own struggles, and many are fighting the same battle that we are fighting. In God's plan, the scars we may try to hide are actually undeniable evidence of the depths of our depravity and the sign to a broken world that we've been healed; that we are a life resurrected by God's grace.

I've often wondered what our resurrected bodies will be like. Will

we be young? Will we be thin? Will we still be bald? Fact is, there are a lot of unanswered questions that won't be resolved until we stand before the Lord. But we can study what the Scripture says about our Lord's resurrected body. Jesus ate and drank. He could appear and disappear. Sometimes He was in disguise, and people didn't recognize Him. But has it dawned on you that Jesus' resurrected body was healed, but He still had the scars from the cross?

Why did Jesus have scars? Jesus is the Almighty God, so He could have easily taken them all away. He could have decided to cover over the wounds with new flesh and made His body exactly as it was before His crucifixion, or even better. But, He didn't. Notice the exchange between Jesus and Thomas in John 20:24-27 when Jesus appeared after the resurrection.

"But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came. The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be unto you." Then he said to Thomas, "Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing..."

What Jesus did on the cross would still be valid whether He had scars or not. But could it be that the scars were left to testify to the work of Christ? Could it be that those scars are there for all like Thomas who need a little more prompting to believe?

We Also Have Scars.

Jesus said anyone who follows Him must follow Him in death. We must pick up our own cross. We may not have physical wounds in our hands and feet, but our sin and rebellion against God can leave painful gashes in our hearts and souls. Some people are more mangled than others by a vicious past. But through Christ, the most severe injuries are mended, and with that renewal comes a story, a story of what God has done.

Think of the value that eyewitnesses hold in a court room. They often have enough influence to determine a person's judicial fate. In the same way, the personal first-hand account of how Christ healed your life is a word of great persuasion. Never underestimate the power of your testimony. It was the evidence that Thomas believed. Even though Jesus was standing before him, even though the others told him about seeing Jesus, it was the scars that convinced Thomas that the man who stood before him truly was Jesus and not an imposter.

Revelation 12:11 says, "And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb, and by the word of their testimony; and they loved not their lives unto the death." Satan knows that the stories behind our scars can destroy his work. That's why he deceives and shames us into hiding them. Jesus displayed his scars with confidence, not disgrace. He knew

what those scars represented. They represented healing, salvation, and peace between God and man. They also represented defeat for the kingdom of darkness.

We're All Still Struggling

Of course, you might be thinking, "My scars are still healing. I still struggle every single day." That may be true. We all have a lot of spiritual growing to do. Actually, there may even be a few additional scars in our future. The good news is that each new scar might give



us a unique opportunity to reach someone else. Hebrews 12:11 says, "Now no chastening for the present seemeth to be joyous, but grievous: nevertheless afterward it yieldeth the peaceable fruit of righteousness unto them which are exercised thereby."

As we await to see in what new direction we may have to carry our cross, use what God has already brought you through to encourage others. II Corinthians 1:4 reminds us that God "Who comforteth us in all our tribulation, that we may be able to comfort them which are in any trouble, by the comfort wherewith we ourselves are

comforted of God." God doesn't need you to be perfect. He just needs you to be willing to use your scars to tell your spiritual story to anyone who is willing to listen.

An Easter Challenge


As Easter approaches, I would like to challenge you to think about your own scars, think of the ways you can use your testimony to share your own journey from death into life. There are others who are going through similar circumstances. They need your encouragement and words of hope. But that means you must be willing to speak about the circumstances you may have tried to hide in the past.

Have you been through a difficult marriage and come out stronger on the other side? Did you have an abortion in the past and find forgiveness through Christ? You could even write an article for *PathPointe*, and it can reach thousands through the magazine or website. Could that be a ministry for you? If Jesus can take a cross; a symbol of death for the cursed and turn it into a symbol of life for the saints, then He can do the same for anyone.

As you travel on this journey through the valley of the shadow of death, may God lead you to others who are traveling the same pathway. Then you can use your scars to show them how our Lord brought you through.

his was a ritual at my house when my youngest son was small. Every insect or reptile had to be saved. We had to catch lizards, grasshoppers, and crickets, but I drew the line at cockroaches. After a hard rain, we had to go

outside and save the earthworms on the sidewalk. What a tender heart! Too bad it wasn't as tender towards his siblings in those days.

He was always showing me what he had found, whether it was a colorful rock or a huge ant hill. He was intrigued by every new discovery. One day he showed me a stick with a cocoon hanging from it. He was full of questions. "What is inside of it? Can we help it get out? Will it be a good insect or a bad one?" The list was endless. I was lucky, because the questions were easy to answer. I knew we could not help the insect out of the cocoon, because that would ensure

its death. As far as what kind it was, I just told him we would have to wait and see.

No one at our house was a specialist on insects, so we had no clue what was inside. We knew something was inside the cocoon, it was going through a metamorphosis, and it was changing. Nothing we could do would affect what was going to exit the cocoon.

As I looked at my son with his innocent wonder and amazement, I realized he was in his cocoon for the next few years. Unlike the insect, many things would affect my son's life. Among the most important

were the things his parents said to him, the things he saw on television, the way he saw his parents treat each other, and most of all, the things he learned about God. Would he accept Christ? Would he live for God? We had a great influence on what he would be when he came out of his cocoon. However, the final product was not entirely up to us.

Unlike the insect, my son has control over whether he emerges from his cocoon as a beautiful creature or a nasty pest. Of course, he has some control over his physical appearance by how well he takes care of himself, but I am mainly referring to the inside, to the heart. His metamorphosis won't end when he is an adult. Hopefully, his heart will become purer and more mature, "a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" with each passing day. So much work and time were involved when he was in his cocoon, but he is out of his cocoon now, and he is still going through a metamorphosis. However, he is in charge of his changes, even though his dad and I are here to guide him.

Our family is going through a metamorphosis. For so many years, everything stayed the same. Our children just got a little older each year. We had growing pains and spent time in the cocoon by teaching values and rules, standards to guide their lives. We laid a foundation of Biblical principles to be followed. Our five kids are married so we have ten now. When our children were emerging from their cocoons, we could not imagine what the future held. We now have

twelve lovely grandchildren, and they are definitely in their cocoons. I wonder what they will be when they emerge?

The most exciting part is to see the metamorphosis of the relationships in our family. Each of the children has matured and grown in his relationship with his spouse and with each other. They still get frustrated with each other, but the depth of their relationships pleases us. My husband and I have grown closer with each passing day and enjoy each minute we share together.

In each person's life, a constant metamorphosis occurs. Changes are all around him. Maybe he will open his eyes and see how he can affect the changes in his life early in the cocoon stage. We all go through physical changes from youth to old age.

When we get older, it seems to take a little longer to heal from a pulled muscle or a hacking cough. I have stopped trying to hide my gray hair, and the wrinkles just won't go away. I cannot hide them anymore. If we take better care of ourselves in the cocoon and throughout young adult years, our physical bodies will be in better shape. But eventually, our bodies do grow old.

More important than our physical bodies, we all go through a spiritual metamorphosis. Christ came to earth to live, die, and rise again for each of us. He came that we might be transformed into new creatures. Our change from death to life is instantaneous, but the metamorphosis to maturity is ongoing. John 10:10 says he came that we might have life and that we might have it more abundantly. Continue to go through your metamorphosis and exercise your wings. See what God has for you.

If you are saved, you are a child of the King! Claim the promises of His Word and live life to the fullest. Maybe when your metamorphosis is complete, the Lord will be able to say to you, "Well done, thou good and faithful servant."


Isn't God Good! How can we help but to be encouraged? Just as He carried us through 2020, we're believing He will see us through this year as well. As we tried

"And Jesus answered and said unto him, Get thee behind Me, Satan: for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and Him only shalt thou serve." Luke 4:8

Much has been spoken of the end times in the season of which we are alive today. Between the COVID-19 pandemic and the wonky way in which our own elections were handled, we feel like the pace "prophetically speaking" has really picked up quite a bit.

I, for one, believe this for many other reasons than the two cited above. I was chatting with a friend recently, and I mentioned to them that it seems like Jesus has looked

down at Satan – as He looked at Judas while seated at the last supper table – and said "that thou doest, do quickly."

Here's one thing to keep in mind though: No matter what "signs" we may be seeing that are pointing to how the end (the antichrist's installation, the one-world government, the disappearance of cash, etc.) is going to take shape, Christ's coming for His church requires no signs! In other words, there's nothing that NEEDS to happen FIRST before Jesus can return. No, we've been taught in the Bible that His first return for the church can happen at any moment.

"So what in the world does all that have to do with Easter, Jason?" That's a great question! Stick with me and you'll find there's ONE theme that brings all of these ideas together. So what is that theme? Worship.

From our focal Bible verse above, Jesus is tempted to do something that Satan would've wanted more than anything else since he's been in existence: He wanted the Son of God to worship him.

You can study more on the doctrine of Satan later (and I recommend that) but suffice it to say, he's an unsavory character. Satan was created by God with the name Lucifer and was very likely the worship leader of



Heaven (Ezekiel 28:11–19). At the very least, he was one of the most, if not THE MOST, beautiful creature God has ever created.

And don't be mistaken... Lucifer was created a GOOD creature. God did not make him evil – he chose to become that. That's why in Ezekiel 28:15 God says, "Thou wast perfect in thy ways from the day that thou wast created, till iniquity was found in thee."

But he fell from that noble position in Heaven because he sought one thing: worship. Satan wasn't too concerned about being God so that he could be good and take care of others. He wasn't even interested in being God so he could show the world how much he loves them (because he doesn't). Oh no... Satan wanted to be God so he could be more powerful than anyone else and press them into worshipping him.

There are many who do worship Satan today. Others bring him glory by ignoring or rebelling against the Lord and His command to be saved. Nothing makes the enemy of our souls happier than to see sinners run FROM the loving overtures of God in Christ Jesus all because they do not wish to behave.

But the resurrection gives us clarity on the subject of worship.

There is only ONE, according to the scriptures, who is worthy of our worship - and that's God. Jesus mentioned this during His own moment of temptation. Christ knew there was no way He was ever going to worship Satan. No matter how much the tempter promised, this would break one of the most sacred commandments ever given.

"If God is the ONE Who is to be worshipped, what does that have to do with Jesus" someone may ask?

The truth is Jesus made some pretty bold claims while He walked down here on earth. He said that He and God (the Father) are ONE. (John 10:30 - "I and my Father are one.") In several other places, He calls God His Father many, many times (Matthew 7:21b - "... but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven.")

Make no mistake about this. Jesus taught without hesitation that He and God were EOUAL. This means, according to the very doctrines taught by our Lord, worshipping and

serving Him was in absolutely no violation of the greatest commandment - to worship and serve God.

"Well, it is one thing to say something like that and quite another to prove it" others may say! My friends, that's exactly what the resurrection of Jesus Christ did! It proved that He was exactly who He said He was.

When Christ arose from the dead, it forever anchored the truth about Him. Jesus Christ is the very Son of God! He alone is worthy of our worship and our service. He is proven to be the one and only begotten Son of God.

"And declared to be the Son of God with power, according to the spirit of holiness, by the resurrection from the dead:"

Romans 1:4




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And Finally...

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
