

"Those that be planted in the house of the LORD shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat and flourishing;" Psalm 92:13-14

Did you know that Mickey Mouse is enjoying his retirement years? You wouldn't know it, just by looking at him. He doesn't seem a day older than when he first appeared on the scene. Yet Mickey Mouse is 94 years old. Not bad when the average mouse only lives for 2 years. Although Mickey is much older than me, he seems to get around a lot better than I do.

To say we live in a youth-oriented culture is an understatement. Older people in our society are often looked upon as a burden to the young. The market place gives little attention to the elderly, and when it does, it seems to perpetuate the myth that aging is always a bad thing. Let's face it, what do you see advertised for the elderly on TV; you would think all we ever need is Burial Insurance, Denture Cream, Ex-Lax, and Depends. Even church ministry and outreach are geared toward the young. That helps to explain two worship services in many churches.

I recently studied an interesting Scripture in Numbers 8:23-26, where the Lord said to Moses, "And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, This is it that belongeth unto the Levites: from twenty and five years old and upward they shall go in to wait upon the service of the tabernacle

of the congregation: And from the age of fifty years they shall cease waiting upon the service thereof, and shall serve no more: But shall minister with their brethren in the tabernacle of the congregation, to keep the charge, and shall do no service. Thus, shalt thou do unto the Levites touching their charge."

I was astounded when I first discovered this verse. The Levites were men officially set apart by God for various ministry functions in the service of the Lord's tabernacle and later in His temple. And God directed them to retire from their fulltime regular ministries at the age of 50!

As they got closer to their "senior" years, God had them turn their regular ministry duties over to

younger Levites. They could assist these younger ministers, but they themselves could not do the ministry work that they had formerly done. Essentially, this verse was saying to them: Do your "regular service" up until a certain age. For the Levites it was 50; for Aaron the priest it was considerably older. But the point is, at some point in our ministries there may come a time to turn our ministry roles over to the next generation. I am not referring to retiring from Christian service, but modifying your Christian service to something more adapted to your stamina and strength.

Moses led Israel until he died at the age of 120! Now that is certainly the exception, not the rule. The point here is that our natural strength, vigor, and health definitely matter and will help us determine the "when" for our transition into new, fruit-bearing activities, better suited with our age, energy, and health. Then we notice King David...

"Moreover the Philistines had yet war again with Israel; and David went down, and his servants with him, and fought against the Philistines: and David waxed faint. And Ishbibenob, which was of the sons of the giant, the weight of whose spear weighed three hundred shekels of brass in weight, he being girded with a new sword, thought to have slain David. But Abishai the son of Zeruiah succoured him, and smote the Philistine, and killed him. Then the men of David sware unto him, saying, Thou shalt go no more out with us to battle, that thou quench not the light of Israel."

II Samuel 21:15-17

Here the aging King David desired to keep going out to battle with his men. But due to his age, he became exhausted. Others had to come to his rescue and save the once great soldier king from being killed by a Philistine. David's men realized that they needed to step up and replace their elderly king on the battlefield, so they exhorted him to let them carry the burden of the battles from then on.

Next, we are reminded of the ministry of the older ladies in the church...

"The aged women likewise, that they be in behaviour as becometh holiness, not false accusers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things; That they may teach the young women to be sober, to love their husbands, to love their children, To be discreet, chaste, keepers at home, good, obedient to their own husbands, that the word of God be not blasphemed."

Older ladies, you have a great ministry opportunity to the younger ladies in your circle of family and friends. The best teachers of womanly virtues to the young women are the older women who

Titus 2:3-5

have learned important lessons over a lifetime. Our society is desperately short of godly role models. Sad to say, this is true even in many of our churches.

There is much fruit to be borne in your later years by being a good example of faithfulness, loyalty, honesty, integrity, prayerfulness, and other aspects of godly character. Even if in your later years you don't hold some "official" role in your church, you can have a profound impact on others by the honorable example you set for them. Believe me, young people need to see such role models.

An important key to all this is found in our text verse: "...shall flourish in the courts of our God. They shall still bring forth fruit in old age; they shall be fat and flourishing." It says they will flourish in the church. Stay devoted to the "house of God." Be there when the doors are open. And go from there built up, energized spiritually, and flourishing in fruitful ministry opportunities even into your old age! I remind you...

Abraham and Sarah began their family when he was over 100 and she passed 90. They became a





blessing to all the nations of the earth.

Joseph was the leader of his family until a ripe old age, Moses became the leader of Israel when he was 80 and continued to lead them until his death at 120.

The apostle John wrote the Book of Revelation when he was well into his 90's.

At 65. Winston Churchill became British Prime Minister and while he was in his 70's wrote his multivolume work History of the British People.

At 72, Golda Meir became Prime Minister of Israel.

At 75, Ed Delano of California bicycled 90 miles a day for a total of 3100 miles in 33 days to attend his 50th college reunion in Worcester. Massachusetts!

Colonel Harlan Sanders began Kentucky Fried Chicken when he was 66.

"Thou shalt rise up before the hoary (grey hair) head, and honour the face of the old man, and fear thy God: I am the LORD."





Anytime we study in the Bible about the end times, it's not long before the subject of the antichrist comes up. Before going too much more in depth about this "king of fierce countenance" as Daniel calls him, let's chat for a moment about how he's able to rise to power. The prophet has much to say about the antichrist's ascension.

"And in the latter time of their kingdom, when the transgressors are come to the full, a king of fierce countenance, and understanding dark sentences shall stand up."

Daniel 8:23

There is something of great significance found in this one prophecy of the antichrist. It says first of all that he will stand in the latter times of "their kingdom." This is actually a reference back to the "times of the gentiles" portion of Daniel's 70th week prophecy found in Daniel chapter nine. God refers to this season as one in which gentile world rulers will dominate the world (and Israel) until Christ Himself ends their rule by judging them harshly and setting up His own kingdom here on Earth.

Jesus alludes to this reference in Luke 21:24 mentioning, "...and Jerusalem shall be trodden down of the Gentiles, until the times of the Gentiles be fulfilled."

So we know that first of all, the closer we get to the "end times" biblically speaking, the closer we are to the antichrist stepping on the scene.

Secondly, our **Daniel 8:23** reference above mentions something else that needs to be brought to your attention. It states that this "king of fierce countenance" will not stand until "...the transgressors are come to the full." Why is this so important? Because one of the LARGEST tell-tale signs that show you are living in the last days is when you begin to see an abundance of ungodliness and wickedness surrounding you.

Think about it for a second... Why did God judge the whole earth with a flood? The Bible answers that in saying, "...God saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every imagination of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually." (Genesis 6:5)

Worldwide wickedness was the reason why God's judgment was needed and merited. Do you know that this is the exact same reason why God is going to judge this current world? You may, but one thing is for sure: this world doesn't realize their wicked deeds are literally speeding all unbelievers toward the wrath of Holy God.

So, thus far we have established that a massive **breaking away** from all things biblical and good is literally **paving the way** – one sinful, rebellious stone at a time – to the coming of the one called the antichrist.

Why won't people see his ascension and use that as a warning for their own souls? To answer that, I have to let you in on a longstanding biblical truth: when a society or nation becomes absolutely godless and antagonistic towards the things of God, they will begin to believe anything about anyone at any time. It doesn't matter if it's true or not, their sinful hearts and reprobate minds will be deceived into believing it (see Romans 1:18-32 concerning a "reprobate mind").

The Bible talks about the reality of this deception in great lengths when discussing the end times.

"Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils;" 1 Timothy 4:1

"Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition;" 2 Thessalonians 2:3

Jesus even references this startling truth when teaching about the current wicked generation. He states, "I am come in my Father's name, and ye receive me not: if another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive." (John 5:43) – a direct reference to the coming antichrist.

Another reason why this wicked ruler who is to come will rise very quickly to great power is because Satan will be behind his ascension. You see a glaring reference to the dark one back in our original text of **Daniel 8:23**. Again, when describing the antichrist, the Scriptures teach us that he will "...understand dark sentences."

Satanists are now doing dastardly things – out in the open – like creating a large statue of the Baphomet (a winged, goat-headed symbol of Satan) as a means to formally challenge the Ten Commandments anywhere they are placed on public, government property.

When the evil curmudgeons decide they don't want the ten commandments displayed in their town, they threaten to bring the satanic statue over and place it next to the Christian monument (under the equal rights clause) until the local government leaders cave in and take away all of it, including the good, religious bedrocks of our society.

Most recently, in another sign pointing to the soon-coming antichrist, a statue commissioned by the United Nations and now featured prominently outside their headquarters in New York shows their "guardian for international peace and security." It looks like the three creatures John saw mingled together into one, representing the antichrist, in the Book of Revelation, chapter 13.

"And the beast which I saw was like unto a leopard, and his feet were as the feet of a bear, and his mouth as the mouth of a lion: and the dragon (Satan) gave him his power, and his seat, and great authority." Revelation 13:2

When you group the horrific scenarios outlined above with current afterschool programs called "After School Satan" coming to a school near you, secret men's groups who look good and respectable on the outside but actually are a recruiting tool for satanism (only sharing the news that they worship the devil with those who gain the rank high enough to be told), and the ever-encroaching elitist mindset that is today telling the world that we know better how to run your life than you do – you can plainly see this world is literally on the doorstep of the antichrist being revealed.

Friends, only God is holding back this evil ruler from coming on the scene. Don't wait it out to see how things turn out. The Lord doesn't want you to be here for that...


