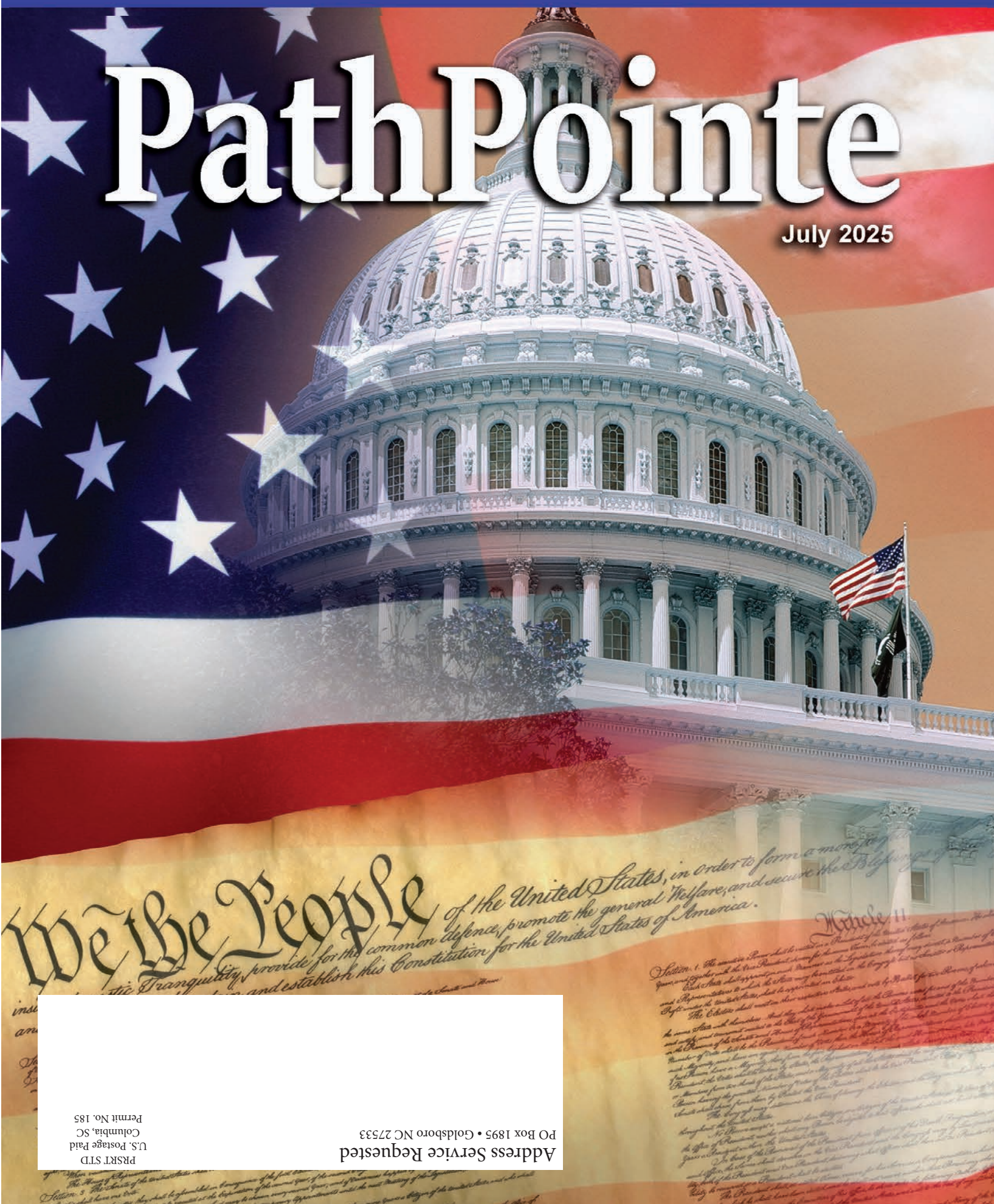

Selfish Citizens & Selfish Worshipers

Something has happened in America since the end of World War II. We have embraced what I might call the modern human rights movement, the era of the selfish citizen.

A strong sense of individualism has always characterized the American spirit. The concept of individual God-given inalienable rights was a cornerstone of our republic. A strong, independent spirit is ingrained in all Americans. However, we also knew that to live in a healthy civil society, we had to look out for one another. For example, if your freedom of speech was threatened, so was mine, even if I didn't like what you said. If your freedom of religion was questioned, I understood that mine might be next. We took a strong stand for personal liberty and

individual rights, but we always knew we had to protect those rights for everyone if we were to retain our own. Or, as Mr. Spock so aptly put it, *"the needs of the many outweigh the needs of the few, or the one."* That is not to say that all decisions should be made based on the consequences for the majority, but it does often provide a good reference point.

This could be as simple as an older child dropping out of school to help support the rest of the family, something my dad had to do. Of course, it also highlights the constant tension between individual rights and the collective welfare of the group. When you think about it, it is a scriptural attitude. While the Bible stresses that each man must give an account of himself to God, a part of that accounting has to do

with how he regards and respects other people.

In many places, the Bible emphasizes the group rather than the individual. In ancient cultures, an individual's identity was often defined by their relationship to a group, such as the family, clan, tribe, or nation. We could certainly see this in the nation of Israel and later in the church.

When Jesus called individuals to follow Him, He always called them to be in a community with one another. In **Matthew 16:18**, we read of Jesus saying: *"That thou art Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church; and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it."* The word translated as "church" in that verse is the Greek word *"ecclesia."* It refers to a group of

individuals who have been called out. I have heard people say they can have church alone on the creek bank while fishing. Of course, your time alone with God can be quite valuable, but it is not a substitute for church. The church is a gathering of believers, usually called out of their homes into a public place, such as an assembly or congregation.

As an individual, I am part of the church, but I am not the church itself. The building with the steeple on top is not a church. It may be a church meeting house, but it is not a church. You may be a spiritual part of the church as the body of Christ, but in the flesh, the composite church is never just one person. There must always be more than one to have church! Perhaps that is why our Lord said, ***“For, where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.”*** **Matthew 18:20**

Now, that is one of the problems with our modern society: We look after number one! We think of ourselves first and foremost. As Americans, we might superficially think of the other guy, but not if it inconveniences us or costs us too much. For example, no one cares about government cuts until they affect them or someone close to them. We may not care about tax increases if they don't affect us. If a new policy is implemented at work, my primary concern is how it will impact me. Cutting waste in the workplace is beneficial unless my job is considered a part of the waste itself.

Sadly, this also flows into the church. All believers know that we come to church to honor, worship,

and praise our Lord. Worship is directed toward God and God alone. So, how can worship possibly be about us and what we like if it is totally about someone else? Is selfish worship even possible? Can such a thing even exist? Can we honestly say with a straight face, ***“I am going to church to worship God as long as I enjoy the service, I don't hear anything I don't want to hear, and people I don't like are not there?”*** Can we really say it is essential for us to worship God if all those selfish stipulations must be satisfied first? It sounds like this idea of worship is more about us than the God we are supposed to worship.

I hear talk of an exciting worship experience. I suppose that can be good. I know there is a fullness of joy and freedom in the presence of the Lord. However, this joy is more than the euphoria of attending an exciting service. Absolute joy changes how we see things; we carry it with us when we leave, and

it changes our lives. It is not like the euphoria of wine that disappears the moment we are sober again. So, how can a worship service be great and awesome when I am the same old person with the same old attitudes and problems after the service is over? That means my worship was not about God at all; it was about me and my temporary escape from reality.

Selfish worship occurs when we prioritize our own feelings and enjoyment, making it about us rather than God. If you get to church and you can't worship God because although nothing is unscriptural, they still don't sing your favorite music, the piano is a bit out of tune, and you see sister Myrtle walk in, and you can't stand her, maybe it never was about God in the first place. When you depend on someone else to put you in the mood to worship, or when someone's face can get you out of the mood to worship, or you can't worship without certain melodies





playing to entice God to show up, it sounds like the whole thing is about you and not God.

We should not have to feel good about everything before we worship God. The children of Israel said they didn't feel like worshipping God in a strange land and were rebuked for their crummy attitude.

“We hanged our harps upon the willows in the midst thereof. For there they that carried us away captive required of us a song; and they that wasted us required of us mirth, saying, Sing us one of the songs of Zion. How shall we sing the LORD'S song in a strange land?”

Psalms 137:2-4

Obviously, they were wrong. Paul and Silas displayed a totally different spirit of praise and worship in **Acts 16:23-26**: *“And when they had laid many stripes upon them, they cast them into prison, charging the jailor to keep*

them safely: Who, having received such a charge, thrust them into the inner prison, and made their feet fast in the stocks. And at midnight Paul and Silas prayed, and sang praises unto God: and the prisoners heard them. And suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken: and immediately all the doors were opened, and every one's bands were loosed.”

Although we all theologically believe in God's incredible power and majesty, for some folks, it just isn't potent enough to overcome our personal feelings and preferences. In other words, God is all-powerful, but without the right kind of music, I can't feel it. God is supreme above everything; however, if Brother Big Bottom comes in, he overpowers my spirit and my desire to worship God just evaporates. Selfish worship occurs when we fail to see God for who He truly is, rather than just who we want Him to be. It also happens when we define the limited environments that we find conducive to worship.

I will close with some good news. When we learn to worship God on His terms, He rises up, our enemies scatter, and those who genuinely love us gather near. Our problems seem to shrink because, in His presence, darkness is turned into light. Let us learn to genuinely worship Him and lift our hearts to give Him the Glory that He deserves, whether we sense His presence or not, whether He rescues us or not, whether He heals us or not, whether the atmosphere is perfect or not. He is still worthy.

Do not fall victim like so many others and become a selfish citizen. As patriots, we abhor their selfishness. Likewise, we should also shun the tendency to become a selfish Christian in the worship of our Lord.

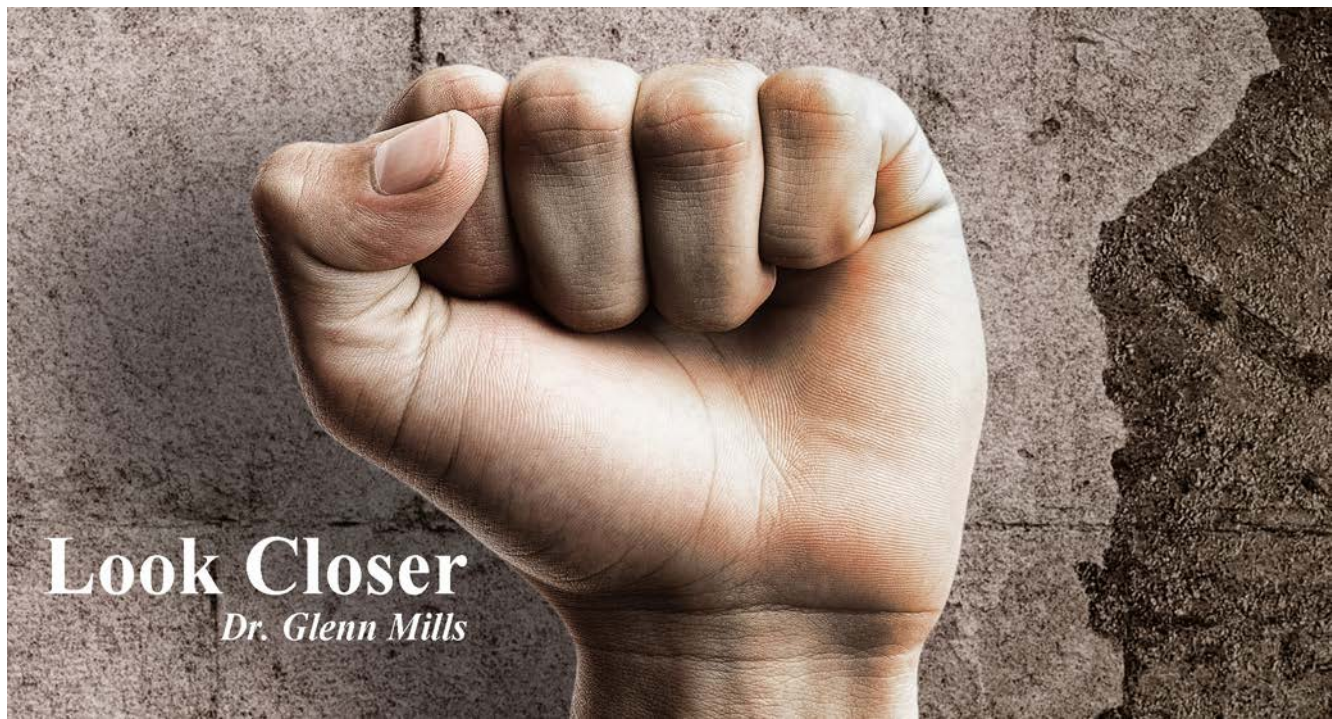

This spirit hates any and everything that belongs to God. **1 John 4:2-3** says, *"Hereby know ye the Spirit of God: Every spirit that confesseth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is of God: And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus*

Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world.” The nature of the old man that many speak of is the spirit of the antichrist in operation. The flesh nature is its own god, opposing God (antichrist) by following its own desires and appetites. Being born into sin, we were already against and opposed to God and Christ.

So why is it important and necessary to believe that Jesus came in the flesh? We need to believe for our salvation. He had to live in a physical body and live a sinless life to pay the penalty for our sins (*which He victoriously did*). We need to believe for us to have victory and power over Satan by yielding our lives to Christ and following the Holy Spirit.

When we activate our faith in Christ and receive Him as our Lord and Saviour, we become the children of God. If we deny Christ came to save us and bring us into God’s family, then we have the antichrist spirit. This is what we see in our world and country. With your faithful support, and God's wonderful grace, look at what we have already accomplished this year...

So far this year, we have placed two new stations on the air.

The first station was a 10,000-watt facility licensed to LaGrange, NC. This station, WGTL, 88.3 FM, was our second Early Light station and serves the Kinston-Goldsboro market.

The second station was WCGI, 89.1 FM, our long-awaited station in Clinton, NC. This station has a 13,000-watt signal and serves the Sampson County area.

A third project involves our radio towers. It takes at least one radio tower to operate each of our stations. We own several of these towers; however, to save on initial expenses, we sometimes lease space on towers owned by others. With leasing costs ever increasing, we are attempting to purchase or erect our own towers when funds allow. We have just concluded negotiations to acquire the 400-foot tower that holds our antenna for WZGO in Aurora. Over the long term, this will save us thousands of dollars.
